

# Armistice Services Announced

## Armistice Peace Meeting and Memorial Service Will Be Held Sunday Afternoon and Evening

The young people of Hartford's churches will unite Sunday evening at the sixth annual Armistice Peace Meeting which will be held in the auditorium of the Hartford Public High school at 8 o'clock. Rev. Dr. Russell J. Olinch of Center Church will be the principal speaker and there will be representatives of the young people who will also be heard including Miss Nellie Wong and Seymour Shornick. Rabbi Abraham J. Feldman will give the invocation, and Rev. Craig G. Whitsitt the Scripture reading. Music will be furnished by Paul Cianci, violinist with Miss Marian Wilbur, accompanist and St. Joseph's Cathedral Choir.

There will also be an Armistice Memorial Service at Christ Church Cathedral, Governor Cross, the Governor's Foot Guard, units of veterans associations and the Gold Star Mothers will be present.

### Advent Christian

Bible readings include the following passages from Genesis 2: 16, 17: "And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."

Correlative readings from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, include the following citation from page 520, line 19: "The tree of knowledge stands for the erroneous doctrine that the knowledge of evil is as real, hence as God-bestowed, as the knowledge of good. Was evil instituted through God, Love? Did He create this fruit-bearer of sin in contradiction of the first creation? This second biblical account is a picture of error throughout."
