

LIBERTY CHORUSES EDITORIAL SUBJECT

'Musical America' Discusses Formation of Organiza- tions in Connecticut.

The Liberty choruses which have been organized throughout the state under the direction of the publicity committee of the Connecticut State Council of Defense are the subject of the leading editorial in this week's "Musical America," which is published in New York and has a national circulation. These choruses have now reached a total of about seventy-five throughout the state. The editorial in "Musical America" follows:—

"The musical life of America has, naturally enough, been infected by the spirit of organization which prevails throughout the land at a time when all of our industrial, economic, scientific and, in fact, social resources are being welded into effective units for the successful prosecution of the war.

"In Connecticut the tendency toward organization is manifested in practical fashion. From October 2 to November 15, forty-two liberty choruses were formed as a result of the campaign directed by the Connecticut State Council of Defense for the especial purpose, we are told, of 'mobilizing the musical forces of the state during the war, as a means of arousing among the people the "will to win."'"
